Hardworking Single Mom Falls Victim to Crime

Heather Perry is a hardworking single mom who works at Native Sun.

She's one of those people her boss can't stop raving about. In the spring, her car died leaving her no way to get her son to school or herself to work. We were in the process of helping her with her car when her Grandmother stepped in to help. Months later, we found out Heather was the victim of a home break-in. Thieves stole her computer, her camera, her TV and her son's toys among other things. The same week, a driver ran her off the road and she lost two tires.

Heather used her rent money to pay for new tires, while we stepped in to pay three months rent and utilities to give her a chance to get back on track.

Small Business Owner Needs A Little Help After Accident

James Wynn is a married father of one child, and the owner of a window replacement company. James was working at a home when the ladder he was standing on went out from under him. He broke both of his legs and one arm – and his

doctors told us this is the kind of accident he was lucky to even survive. James was able to cover most of his bills and mortgage following the accident, but had a JEA bill he couldn't cover. We took care of his JEA bill, and James is on his way to recovery.

Bus Driver Gets Assistance For New Apartment

Nakia Custis is a Jacksonville city bus driver who had to undergo surgery in March. The surgery caused her to be unable to work until May, and she was evicted from her apartment. Nakia found a new place, but needed help with a deposit. We covered her deposit and first month's rent so she could focus on getting back on her feet.

These are the types of emergency programs we offer and try to assist with throughout our community. We hope that with your continued support we will be able to help many more families throughout the Northeast Florida area. ☺

Milton McGee of McGee Entertainment donated his time and emceed the party and David Dehof Photography donated his time to take some fabulous pictures of our party.

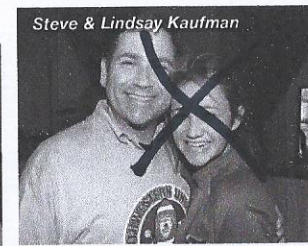

At the end of 2012 we assisted 21 local families. I was fortunate enough to help deliver many of the gifts to the families that we met at the United Way offices. These families had no idea what was happening, and some even seemed a little nervous. We listened to the stories of struggles they had gone through, and it was truly moving.

We also had the honor of providing an emergent gift at Christmas to a family from the northside who recently lost their father. The dad died suddenly in October. Three weeks later they had an apartment fire, had to move and lost most of their belongings. Then Mom had a medical emergency as well as one of the five children. One hit after another. We were able to assist this family with 3 months rent and a utilities credit to help them get back on their feet.

Talk about the meaning of the holiday season! It was an awesome feeling and it reminded me how important my job is with the foundation.



We're busy prepping for this year's Holiday Program, and our hope is that it will be even bigger and better for the families who will receive these gifts – these gifts made possible by all of you who continue to support and give of your time and resources. We also continue to screen and provide emergent gifts to our neighbors in need.

We know that Dad is watching us and is full of pride in the work we are doing. 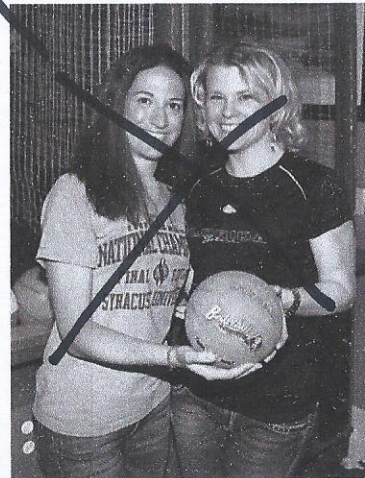
